Rex will call and talk to Coldwater, B. Jackson or Parsons about getting a grinder out here to remove the asphalt grind it down to a fine material that we can spread and will stay in place better.

Council Member Josh Anderson: He still needs to investigate the leak that is coming down in the kitchen pantry to see if he can find out where it is coming from

Council Member Craig Hawkes: With help he was able to fix the leak over by Jenny Murrow house. Craig and Cody will need to complete the state certification for the water. The chlorinator needs to be finished, and Craig will see if Cody has time to help him finish that up. Once that is complete, we will not need to buy bleach for the water system, and it will happen automatically.

Payment Vouchers and Paid Bills were reviewed.


MOTION Council Member Mark Sorensen moved to approve vouchers and paid bills. Council Member Rex Nessen seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
